

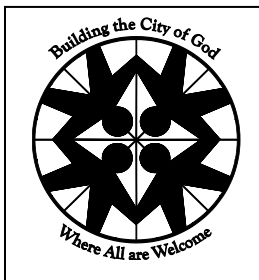

Greetings, potential Confirmation Candidate! I hope you and your family are having a wonderful summer.

This packet is being sent to anyone who is old enough to decide if they would like to begin Year I of the Confirmation program at Blessed Sacrament this year, (because they are in grade 9, or older).



When you were younger, you were either part of the religious education program at Blessed Sacrament, or at another church; or you received your religious education at a Catholic school. But Confirmation is different. The Confirmation program is a two-year program which helps to prepare you to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

Sacraments are not received at school; you receive your sacraments through a church. So even if you go to a Catholic high school, you still prepare for the sacrament of Confirmation through your church; either Blessed Sacrament, or another church. Receiving the sacrament of Confirmation does not mean you have “graduated from CCD”, or that you have learned all there is to know about what it means to be a Catholic. What it does mean is that you have decided be fully initiated into the Church and sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit which strengthen you to live out your Christian life in the world. You want to continue along the faith journey that your parents started you on when they had you baptized many years ago. **As you think about whether or not you wish to enter the program, please note that Confirmation is NOT necessary to be married in the Church. It is only required if you become a godparent or sponsor. So your overriding reason to be Confirmed should be your desire to continue on your faith journey as a Catholic young adult.**

If you decide you want to begin the Confirmation program at Blessed Sacrament please fill out the registration materials and send them in by **Friday, September 9**. Of course, you might decide that you're not ready at this time to prepare for the sacrament; or that your schedule is too busy right now to commit to the Confirmation program; or that you would prefer to participate in a program at a different parish. That is your decision to make. In this packet you will find:

- A Schedule and the Expectations of the Confirmation Program; this is for you to keep.
- A Registration Form; please fill out and return by Sept. 9.
- A Discipline Policy Please sign and return by Sept. 9.
- A Request for Sacramental Certificate Form; this is for Year I and any other new candidates. If you were baptized at Blessed Sacrament, you must fill out the form and return it by Sept. 9 in order to generate the search for your Baptismal certificate, even if you made your First Communion at the parish. Anyone baptized elsewhere must contact that parish and have them mail us or fax (508)-668-3554 a copy of your baptism certificate.
- Hale Reservation forms; Year I candidates and those Year IIs who didn't go last year must fill out the permission slip and medical release form for the

- retreat to be held on October 30. Please turn in by Sept. 9
- Volunteer Application for any parents willing to get involved. Please include with the other materials you turn in, or Year I parents may hand it in at the orientation.
 - A Covenant Form; ***please note: the Covenant Form is only for Year I candidates to fill out, and it should not be mailed in; it should be brought with you to the mandatory Year I Orientation, which is on Sunday, Sept. 25, at 4:30.***

I am looking forward to getting to know the Blessed Sacrament community and to my work with each of you in the Confirmation program. Please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions.

Confirmation Schedule, 2011-2012

Years I and II

You and your parent(s) have decided that you want to be confirmed in the Roman Catholic Church. We celebrate that choice and have designed a two year program to help you be ready to receive the sacrament. You prepare to be Confirmed at Blessed Sacrament by completing all the elements in the two year program.

All Year I Confirmation candidates are expected to attend an Orientation Session with their sponsor or a parent/guardian.

The Orientation for Year I candidates is on Sunday, Sept. 25, from 4:30-6:30PM, in the Blessed Sacrament Church*.

* We will meet in the church for the mandatory Orientation, to explain what is expected of the Confirmation candidates, and what is asked of their parents and sponsors. As part of the Orientation, all candidates and their parent (or sponsor) will participate in a special "Rite of Entrance", as part of our 5:30 Mass. This is an important beginning to the Confirmation program. **Year I Candidates and a parent or sponsor should plan to attend this Mass, rather than a Mass earlier in the day; they should bring their signed covenant forms, which will be used during the Mass.**

Rehearsals will be held on Wednesday, April 25, between 6 and 9PM. More details will follow in the spring.



2011-2012 Confirmation Program

Here are the program's four expectations:

1. Attend and Participate in ALL Monthly Sessions, as well as the Orientation in September. (Only ONE *EXCUSED* absence is allowed for the entire year.)

Sessions are once a month on Sundays from 4:30-7:30PM, and include everyone participating in our 5:30PM Mass; a snack is served after Mass, followed by our small group discussions.

Confirmation candidates are expected to be there for the *entire session*, (before Mass, during Mass, and after Mass...) in order to be considered to have completed the program.

If candidates have some other regular commitment that occurs on Sunday evenings, that they cannot miss for our monthly Confirmation sessions, then they will not be able to commit to the Confirmation program at our parish this year. The dates for this year's orientation and monthly sessions are on the other side of this sheet.

2. Participate in a Service Project with Your Group

In addition to the sessions, Confirmation candidates participate in **one service project each year, with their small group, not on their own.** We focus on one of the corporal works of mercy, doing what Jesus called us to do: feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, and visit the sick and imprisoned. Catholic faith grows and matures in shared community; therefore candidates will be expected to complete this service project with their small group, *not as individuals*. We know that many of you are doing community service with your schools or other organizations; however those will not count towards your Confirmation service project.

3. Participate in a One-Day Retreat

All Confirmation candidates will be expected to participate in our day-long retreat; a time for prayer, discussion, group activities, food, and fun. These retreats are not optional; it is an intentional piece of our program, and its goal is for us to build community together.

Retreat for Year I Candidates: Participate in a retreat day at an outdoor ropes course.

This retreat offers exhilarating and adventurous activities which encourage personal growth, group unity and spiritual development; and it accomplishes one of our biggest goals: to build community. And even though it's fun, it does have a theological purpose too... it helps us to see how we are "The body of Christ" for each other. This has been a big hit with the Confirmation candidates in the past! This retreat is held in the fall, so that all Year I Candidates will have the chance to get to know each other sooner.

Retreat for Year II Candidates: Participate in a retreat day at the Connors Retreat Center in Dover, MA. This day has also been successful in the past; this is due in great part to our Peer Ministers, who share their faith stories and coordinate the whole day. It is a chance for the Confirmation candidates to come away together, before being Confirmed, to realize that they are the "church" at Blessed Sacrament; that this is their own faith, not just their parents' faith.

4. Write Monthly Reflections

Each month, Confirmation candidates will be asked to write a one-page reflection, which will be collected at the next meeting. These will give candidates a chance to think more about what was discussed, and how it impacts their lives as Catholics. **It is a key learning component, and so the expectation is that these reflections will be turned in on time.**

Confirmation Program Fees:

(Fees must accompany the completed registration)

The registration fee is \$100 per Confirmation candidate, until September 09, 2011.

After Sept. 09, 2011, the late registration is \$125.

There is also an additional \$85 fee collected at this time, for the Confirmation retreat.

Please note: We collect all of the fees for the Confirmation program up front, including money for the retreat, and bus transportation. You will not be asked for additional money later in the year.

Families who use the church envelopes and give more than \$500 to the parish annually, receive half off the per child registration fee. The fee for the retreat remains the same.

To receive the credit, a family must have verifiable contributions through using weekly parish envelopes.

Archdiocesan and special collections are not included.

**BLESSED SACRAMENT CHURCH
CONFIRMATION PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS AND DISCIPLINE POLICY**

BEHAVIOR

Participants in the Confirmation Program are expected to behave in a respectful and mature manner at all times. Below is a list of some specific expectations.

- Turning off cell phones (no texting) at all times during the monthly session, except during snack time, and at all retreats and service projects
- Being reverent , respectful and participatory at Mass
- Not bringing gum, candy or any other food or beverage into the church
- Listening attentively and refraining from talking during presentations, and when others are speaking during small group discussions
- Cleaning up after snack time by throwing away trash, and uneaten food and beverages in the receptacles provided
- Treating the volunteers with respect and courtesy at all times
- Keeping church and school property clean and in the condition in which it is found

Any candidate who is acting in any manner that does not meet these expectations will be reprimanded, and a repeat offense will result in a meeting with the candidate, his or her parent(s), the Pastor, and Coordinator of Youth Ministry. At that time the candidate may be informed that he/she must wait for a more appropriate time to be Confirmed.

ATTENDANCE

Candidates are expected to attend ALL dates: monthly sessions, retreats and service projects. Service projects and retreats MUST be completed in order for the candidate to move forward to the next step of the program, be it Year II or the sacrament of Confirmation. If a student misses a monthly session, it requires a phone call from a parent, and the candidate must contact the adult facilitator about the presentation and make up the reflection. If a second monthly session is missed, a meeting will be called with both the candidate and his/her parents to assess his/her continued participation in the program. A third absence will result in a suspension from the program until such time as the candidate is able to fully commit to the requirements of the program.

With gratitude to God for the gift of faith, we prayerfully embrace this period of preparation in the Name of Jesus. We ask for the strength of the Holy Spirit to guide us, our catechists, and our parish family toward the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation. We state today our intention to grow stronger in communion of faith, hope, and love, fulfilling the promises of Baptism. May God bring this good work begun today to completion.

I, the Confirmation candidate, am ready to begin my preparation for receiving the sacrament of Confirmation. I know that there is no rush to receive my Confirmation; that this is not a "graduation from" what I have only just begun to learn about my faith as a child; rather this is an "initiation into" the Catholic Church as a young adult. I am ready to confirm, to strengthen, what I already received at my Baptism: the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Because I am choosing to take this next step, I realize that I am the one who is responsible, not my parents, to make sure I commit to all aspects of the Confirmation program at Blessed Sacrament. There are many different Confirmation programs, but I have decided to be part of the parish community at Blessed Sacrament.

Therefore,

I promise to attend and participate fully in all of the monthly sessions.

I will reflect on what we have talked about at the monthly sessions, and I will write the reflection papers that are asked of me.

I will attend, and fully participate in, our one day retreat.

I will be responsible for communicating to my parents the details of my small group's service project, and I will remember to attend.

I will be reverent and respectful during our monthly 5:30 Mass. I know that I and my peers are now responsible for modeling to the younger members of our parish what it means to fully participate in the celebration of Mass.

If I decide that I am not ready to continue the Confirmation program at this time, I will talk this over with my parents or some of the staff at Blessed Sacrament, who might be able to help me with some of the questions I'm struggling with.

I recognize the commitment required, and will honor the Confirmation schedule and give it priority when conflicts arise. If I am not able to keep all of these commitments, I know that I may be asked to wait until a later time when I may be more ready to receive my Confirmation.

I support my son/daughter’s decision to participate in the Confirmation program at Blessed Sacrament. I understand that many of the Confirmation candidates participate in the two year program in grades 9 and 10, but this is not true of everyone. Some young people are not ready, or perhaps their schedule does not allow them to be able to commit to the program at this time. So I understand that no one is going to be “rushed through” the program; there is no deadline to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

Therefore, as a parent,

I will support my son/daughter, in whatever way I can, as they go through the two-year Confirmation program and prepare to receive the third Sacrament of Initiation into the Catholic Church.

I will encourage my son/daughter to be responsible for their own commitments in preparing for Confirmation; remembering that they are the one who needs to call or send an email if they’re going to be late or miss something; and that they need to be the one to be responsible for their commitments.

I will support my child as he/she makes the important decision of who will be their sponsor.

I will remember that my child, or the Blessed Sacrament staff, might discern that they are not ready to receive their Confirmation at this time.

I will encourage my child to attend Mass every Sunday, since this is one of the basic things that makes us Catholic; and I know that the best way to encourage them to go to Mass, is to attend Mass with them.

I understand that Confirmation is not the end, but rather the beginning, of my son/daughter’s faith journey as a young adult Catholic; and that we will continue to find ways to help strengthen our parish community.

I know that whenever I have a question or a concern, or need support, I am encouraged to contact the Coordinator of Youth Ministry, or anyone on the Blessed Sacrament pastoral staff.

- Adult Facilitator** – Assist at Confirmation classes which meet monthly, on Sundays from 4:30-7:30; including Mass. Facilitators do not prepare lesson plans, but rather listen to the guest presenter for that month's topic, along with their small group of 10 -12 teens, and then, along with a Peer Minister co-facilitate the small group discussions. Facilitators also attend the retreat and the service project with their group. Most facilitators find the experience very rewarding.
 - Chaperone** – Help with any special events that are scheduled, particularly social events.
 - Snack Hour Host** – Assist in monthly set-up and distribution of food (pizza or other item) for Confirmation class, usually from 6:00pm – 6:45pm
