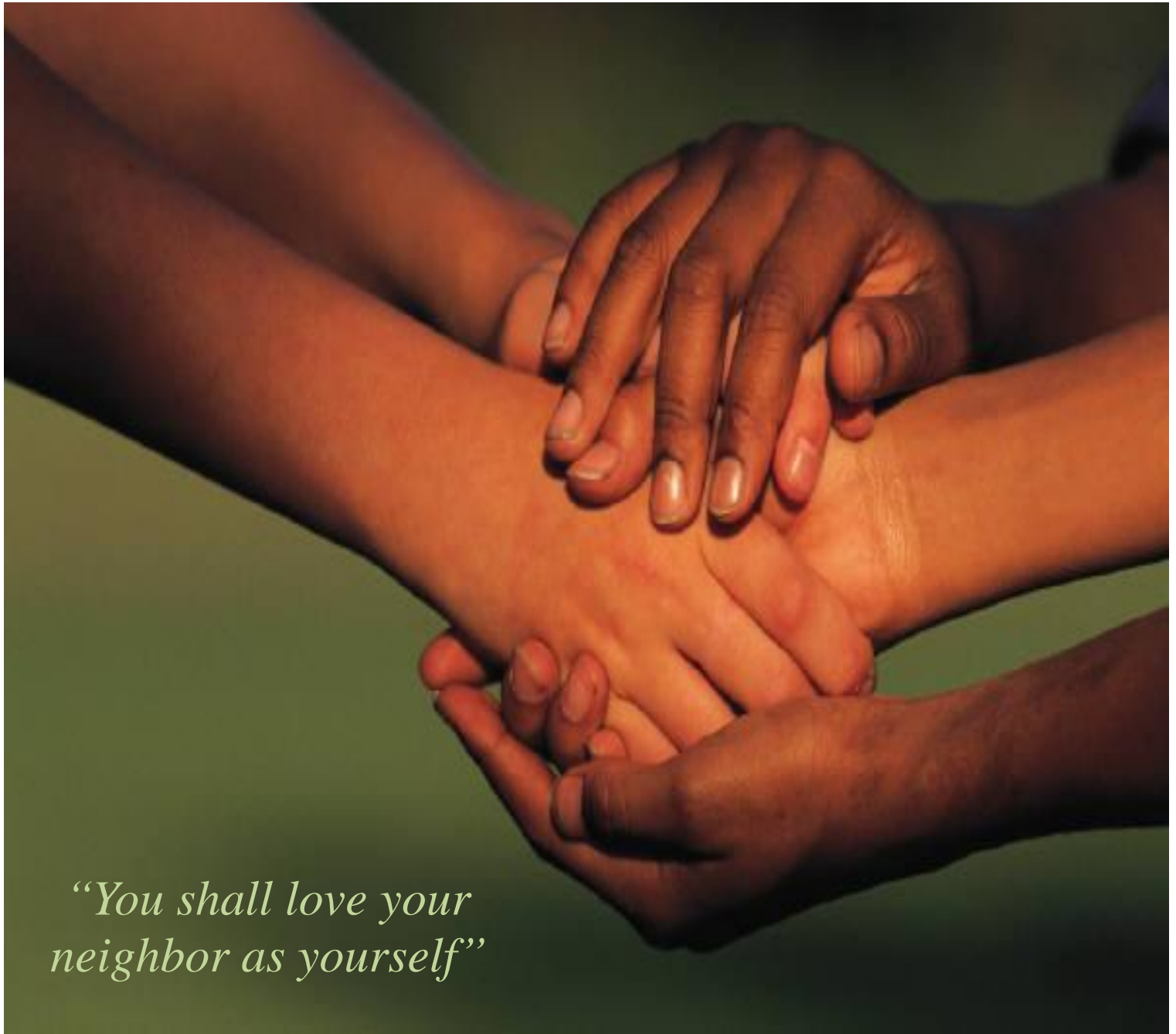

## A Message from Our Co Pastors

“ I have called you by your name, giving you title, though you knew me not. I am the Lord, and there is no other’.

When I read that line, I thought, ‘There is a summation of my life’. When I go back and think about my decision to enter the priesthood, I had no idea that God had anything to do with it. I called you by name and you knew me not.

I have to say that it was not until I was ordained a few years and really felt that there was something missing, that I came to know God. I knew a lot about God, but I had yet to develop a relationship with him. It was not until some years after ordination that I came to admit that there was a greater being than myself. Oh I knew there was a God, but I saw God as judge. I had yet to recognize him as shepherd, and to acknowledge that he had anything to do with the day-to-day aspects of life.

One thing that I have come to appreciate about the 12-step program is that recovery is dependent on the higher power. I have come to recognize in my own life that a greater quality of life is found in dependence on God.

The gospel story talks about how the Pharisees were trying to entrap Jesus. We know that this is not an isolated incident. Yet we also know that Jesus never gave up the mission. We know that Jesus was both God and man. Our faith tells us that he was fully God and fully man; a mystery for sure. Yet if we were to look at it from the human perspective, how many of us would hang in there if the powers that be were trying to entrap us? When I think of the journey of Jesus and my own journey, I often think of the passage in the scriptures that pictures Jesus on the hillside overlooking the city of Jerusalem before he enters on Palm Sunday. The story indicates that as he stood there, he wept. He says something to the effect, ‘If only they knew what made for their peace’. They missed the time of their visitation. I have been fortunate enough to stand on that very hillside and look at the city that is still in chaos. It is truly a very moving place.

Yet we know for a fact that Jesus walk into the city to fulfill the mission his father had given him. In my mind I see him walking in with his head held high even though he knew what was before him, that some of these same people who were praising him would days later be calling for his death. Yet with his focus on God, he was enabled to do the right thing, the thing that brought him peace and gave us eternal life.

Think of Peter, how he was enabled to walk on water as long as he trusted and kept his focus on God. When he lost that, he fell flat on his face. Yet God was there to pull him up and to encourage him to try again. We really do not know if he did. I suspect, however that is exactly what he did.

When you think of it; it really is our story. There are times during our own journeys that things are going along just fine, and there are times when we fall flat on our faces. Yet, as with Peter, there is the hand of God to enable us to continue. What do we do?

It is in coming to recognize the call of God, recognizing his presence in our lives, trusting in his wisdom and guidance, and putting all that into action that we come to the peace he promises us.

## CHANGING THE WAY WE CELEBRATE

The Introductory Rites begin when you stand for the opening song and end when we sit together for the first reading from Scripture. After our opening song, the priest says the words for the Sign of the cross and we answer "Amen". Next comes a formal greeting. In the revised Missal, our response changes from "And also with you" to "**And with your spirit**". Why? The new translation moves us closer to the Latin original. It also brings our English text into line with other modern language translations. The change captures another piece of our faith tradition. At Mass we gather "in the Spirit", that is, in the power of the Holy Spirit given to all of us by Christ. The priest greets us with the hope that the love, grace and power of Christ will be in all of us: 'The Lord be with you'. We respond hoping that the same gifts be with the "spirit", the inner life of the priest who will lead us in prayer and who will speak and act in the name of Christ. The greeting and response is a statement of who we are together as we assemble to hear God's Word and celebrate Christ's Eucharist. The spirit and gifts of the risen Christ fill our inward selves, our "spirits", as we come together in Christ's name and presence.
